PUBLIC HEALTH ADVISORY BOARD PURPOSE & RESPONSIBILITIES



PURPOSE

Our purpose is to advise the Tehama County Health Services Agency Executive Director and the Tehama County Board of Supervisors on public health issues, programs, and services affecting the health of our community.

RESPONSIBILITIES

ADVISE: Advise the Agency's Executive Director and the Tehama County Board of Supervisors on policies, goals, and operation of Public Health.

REVIEW: Review the community's needs and the adequacy of health care services, programs, access to providers, and facilities to meet those needs.

ENCOURAGE: Encourage support throughout the county for the development and implementation of effective public health programs.

ASSIST: Assist Tehama County Health Services Agency Public Health in assessing the community's health needs, prioritizing the identified needs, and proposing actions to meet identified needs.

PREPARE: Prepare an annual report of Public Health Advisory Board's activities for Public Health to present to the Tehama County Board of Supervisors.

PROVIDE: Provide advocacy with state and federal legislative bodies on health and budgetary issues affecting Tehama County.

Improving the Oral Health of our Community

Accomplishments

We are proud of these accomplishments over the past year.

- Establish a solid partnership with Adventist Health to implement schoolbased mobile dental services in Tehama County. We have been able to conduct monthly virtual meetings with their planning committee, as we formulate the launching of the project in February of 2022.
- Collaboration with Butte County Oral Health team is a promising alliance, that has resulted in a mutually supportive partnership.
- Conducted a very successful meeting with the Los Molinos School District Superintendent, to discuss school-based sealant clinics utilizing portable dental units. These are the first schools that we would be targeting with oral health services.
- Conducted a virtual meeting with the Brian Dudar DDS, Dental Director of Northern Valley Indian Health and Nancy Reed RDH to strategize and organize future kindergarten oral health assessments in Tehama Schools.
- Amid the COVID-19 restrictions, we were able to actively participate in NCCDI "Dad's Day" in person event to promote oral health through many interactive projects and activities.





Improving the Oral Health of our Community

- Conducted two strategic planning meetings (August 2021 and December 2021). A Strength, Weakness, Opportunity, Threat (SWOT) Analysis was conducted.
- The California Department of Public Health award of \$30,000 to reimburse the grantee accordingly to enhance current activities being performed that support in school-linked dental programs. With this money we were able to purchase mobile dental equipment to be used in the schools.
- In partnership with Northern Valley Indian Health Dental Clinic, from July December 2021, the Children's Oral Health Outreach Coordinator screened 8 schools (42 classes). Schools included Los Molinos Elementary, Middle, Antelope Elementary, Metteer Elementary, Jackson Heights Elementary, Bidwell Elementary, Fluornoy Elementary and Kirkwood Elementary.
- The Corning Healthcare District Elder Services Newsletter's December edition was focused on oral health and seniors. They published "It Is All Connected!" Mouth and Body Health for Seniors article written by the Local Oral Health Program Coordinator. Another article, "Oral Health Means More Than Healthy Teeth!" and oral health fun facts was also published.
- We should add something about the Book Club with First 5 and oral health books for NCCDI Head Start Centers and State Preschools.









Improving the Oral Health of our Community

Goals

We look forward to reaching these goals.

- Utilize the American Academy of Pediatrics evidence based oral health literacy campaign Brush, Book, Bed, as the core of a multifaceted program to increase awareness in the community of the importance of oral health to total health and to link three important health messages into one message about nighttime routines. The three messages to obtain a healthy nighttime routine are to brush the child's teeth, read together, and to set a regular bedtime.
- Establish a school based Oral Health Program that provides access to oral health services.
- Continue training Medical Providers to add fluoride varnish to wellchild exams.
- Continue to collaborate with the three local Indian Health Dental Clinics; Rolling Hills Dental Clinic, Greenville Rancheria Dental Clinic, Northern Valley Indian Health Dental Clinic, Adventist Health, the Shasta College Dental Hygiene Program, along with the Shasta Dental Hygiene Society and the Northern California Dental Society.
- Continue to identify the gap in access to hospital dentistry services in the County for young children and identify funding sources to assist with follow up care that families cannot afford.
- Support the Virtual Dentistry Program so it can sustain itself by providing access to oral health services in the county.
- Keep the Tehama County Board of Supervisors apprised of the status of oral health care accessibility for low-income individuals in our county.
- Accomplish the state approved Oral Health Community Health Improvement Plan's goals and objectives.
